


## Films for screening June - August 2022

Date	Title	Description
8 Jun	The guardians (15 certificate)	Drama. With every man called up, women are left to work a French family farm during World War I. Help comes from a young female orphan, a hard worker who does not balk at any task.
13 July	Goodbye Lenin! (15 certificate)	Comedy drama. A wholeheartedly communist mother awakens from a long coma after the fall of the Berlin Wall. Her son tries to protect her from a fatal shock by craftily concealing her country's fate from her.
10 Aug	The book thief (12A certificate)	Drama set in World War II Germany. Young Liesel steals books and shares them with others, while her adoptive parents protect a Jewish refugee.

# The ladykillers

Black comedy crime film, the last of the splendid series of Ealing comedies. An eccentric band of thieves, posing as an amateur string quintet, rent rooms from an equally eccentric elderly widow. They pull off a bank robbery, but slip up in front of the old woman and agree they need to murder her. However, they wind up double-crossing each other before achieving their objective...

The British Film Institute ranked this film as the 13<sup>th</sup> greatest film of all time. It has delighted audiences around the world with its high-spirited mixture of quirky slapstick, cynicism and guileless innocence. Alec Guinness is wonderful as the band's leader, wearing outrageous false teeth, and Peter Sellers also impresses in the role that launched his career.

This will be the fourth of the ever popular Ealing comedies we have screened, and just as entertaining as the others.
