

Hannah and her sisters

This intelligent, ironic, funny and painful comedy drama spans two years in the lives of its large cast of characters - New Yorkers engaged in Manhattan's two sexiest industries, art and money. It begins and ends at family Thanksgiving dinners, with the dinner in the middle of the film acting as a turning point for several people, amongst whom are: an accountant in love with his wife's sister; a TV executive who fears he is going to die; a woman whose cocaine habit has made her life a tightrope of fear; an artist who pretends to be strong but depends pitifully on his girlfriend. This sounds heavy – but the film itself is lightened by a witty, sometimes hilarious script and a superb ensemble cast.

It won three Oscars and became one of Woody Allen's biggest box office successes. Critics also loved it. And the American Film Institute has placed it in three prestigious categories: the 100 greatest American films, the 100 funniest films, and the 100 greatest love stories. Throw in a most appealing soundtrack, and you have a film that should make us forget our pandemic for a couple of hours...
